Thanks to all who helped make our first fundraiser of the year a success. Everyone pitched in, enjoyed a nice breakfast, and had some fun.

Here is our report:

Arranged date with Applebee's and the manager printed tickets for us and gave us a generic flyer to use.

- 1. We publicized the event through our members, Club website, and Facebook page.
- 2. We sold the presale tickets provided by Applebee's at \$10.00 for adults, \$6.00 for children, 2 and under free with a profit of \$6.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children.
- 3. Had a bake sale with generous amounts of donated bakery which almost all sold out for a profit of \$159.
- 4. Had one 50/50 raffle with a profit of \$159.
- 5. Sold approximately 130 tickets with about 110 being used that day.
- 6. Many Club members bought tickets, volunteered, and baked.
- 7. Although we sold more tickets this year, Applebee's changed the way we were charged. We paid Applebee's \$4 for each ticket sold. Even if tickets were not used, we still paid \$4 per ticket. This makes our profit smaller than the year before, even though we made more on the bake sale and 50/50 tickets.
