This month I'll highlight October & November 1956, Vol. 1, Nos. 2 and 3

October's Program: Sykora Furs will present a showing of gorgeous furs.

November's Program: Grapho-Analysis will present a talk on handwriting analysis.

A section of the newsletter called "In the Spotlight" provided recaps of various members—one a current member and the other a new member. October's current member was about Marion Cook, FPJWC's first president:

Marion Cook basks in the spotlight this month. Now serving as Parliamentarian, Marian rates the distinction of being our only "Past Prez." We can thank Marion for getting the Fairview Park Junior Women's Club started. She obtained sponsorship from the senior group, and with the loyal support of

fourteen girls, started the Juniors. Organization plans got underway in October 1954, with the first Kick-Off Meeting being held in February 1955. Having a new baby, plus an emergency operation those months didn't daunt this energetic gal! Marion and Bob Cook were married in 1947 and now have a cute trio, David-7, Dale-5, and Marilou-2. Born in Buffalo, Marion came to Cleveland at the age of three. After graduating from West High, she attended Michigan University, where she belonged to Alpha Xi Delta. Marion is quite a gal...we can be proud to have her still working hard for the Fairview Juniors.

November: After a surprising surge of membership applications, the Membership Committee voted to close the Club membership at 150. Applicants can submit their application forms and will be admitted as openings are available. Members are reminded that they cannot miss three consecutive meetings without a legitimate excuse, or they will be dropped from the Club.

October: Ways & Means is planning a Fall Dance at the Saddle Inn on Saturday, October 20th from 10 p.m. until 2 a.m. Tickets are only \$2.50.

November: Ways & Means reports that a profit of \$144 was made at the year's first fundraiser, a Fall Dance at the Saddle Inn on October 20th. Their next event will be a bring-your-own Box Lunch Bridge on November 13th at the Cabin. For only 65¢, players will be eligible for table and door prizes and a grand prize of a turkey.

October: The Mentally Retarded Committee had been mentioned in a Plain Dealer article looking for used instruments for the Apple Creek Sanatorium near Wooster, and the article generated a lot of donations. The Committee was planning to go to the Sanatorium later in the month to deliver the instruments.

November: The Committee for the Mentally Retarded is selling Christmas candy for the ward. A December 8th visit is planned and they asked for donations of records and radios (which don't have to be in working order).

October: The Mental Health Committee held a wiener roast at Apple Creek, and afterwards visited their adopted ward for group singing and socializing.

November: The Mental Health Committee visited the Cleveland Receiving Hospital in October and the men there planned a Halloween-themed visit, including bobbing for apples. They note that this time all the men attended. When the Committee arrives, the men are mostly serious, but are smiling and happy after the visit.

October: The Club is in the process of organizing Bridge and Canasta groups. Forty-one members signed up for bridge, with nine substitutes, and enough members signed up for two Canasta groups.

November: Scores for the Bridge and Canasta groups were posted.

October: *The Fairnighters Dance Club has fifty couples and held a successful first dance. However, because of limited space, they will limit attendance at the dances to one hundred couples, including guests. The next dance is scheduled for December 14th.*

November: *The Fairnighters Dance Club reminded everyone about the upcoming Christmas Dance on December 14th.*

November: *Ten new members were welcomed after signing up at the October meeting. [Historian's Note: On a personal note, I'm passing this on as something that still makes me laugh when I think of it. I see that Marie (Mrs. Everett) Hood joined the club in October 1956. She lived in the house directly across the street from me. In early November 1977, a couple of weeks after we had moved in, she walked over to welcome me to the neighborhood. Her house had just gone up for sale and she welcomed me, but mentioned that it's too bad we didn't have a chance to see her house first, as she's sure I would have liked it better. I was actually pretty excited about finally getting our first (and current) house, and just laughed.]*
