#### **Looking Back**

This month I'll highlight the December 1956 and January 1957, vol. 1, nos. 4 and 5 newsletters. Again, if you are interested in reading the newsletters in their entirety, please let me know.

**December Program:** Christmas Music presented by the Fairview High School Chorus under the direction of Frank Barr.

**January Program:** The Fairview Players will present "The Old Lady Shows Her Medals," a one act play featuring two Club members and others.

#### President's Message:

**December:** A new Civic Committee was recently established, with the purpose of creating an interest between the Club and our community to fulfill our civic obligations. The Committee will carry out various civic projects that will benefit the community on a long-range basis. A suggested first project would be to work with Fairview Hospital to set up a Day Nursery for children of employees. The Club would maintain and supervise the nursery and secure personnel to run it. A planning meeting will be set if there is enough interest.

**January:** Ways & Means will hold a Dessert Bridge and Style Show at Halle's Westgate Room. A donation of \$1.25 is being asked. Homemade desserts will be featured, and Halle's will furnish the fashions with Club members serving as models. A beautiful silver-blue muskrat stole with mink collar and mink tails will be raffled at the dessert bridge. Tickets are  $25\varepsilon$  each or five for \$1.

**December:** The candy sale for the Committee for the Mentally Retarded was a success. The goal was reached and they were able to enclose a dollar bill in each Christmas card for their boys. The Committee Chair explained that this group had adopted a boys' ward at Apple Creek Hospital consisting of 105 boys. The Committee makes four visits per year and plans entertainment, provides refreshments and collects various items needed at the hospital.

[Historian's note, per the Apple Creek site: Apple Creek State School opened in February 1931 in what had been a tuberculosis hospital. It was the third center in the state, the others being in Columbus and Gallipolis. Most patients in the early days were "feeble-minded," as they were labeled at the time. The place held a mixture of the mentally retarded and mentally ill, alcoholics, cerebral palsy sufferers, and unwed mothers. By 1947, the institution had blossomed into a small city covering more than 2,100 acres, much of it dedicated to raising crops, chickens, cattle, and hogs. It had its own power and sewage-treatment plants, along with cemeteries where 128 people are buried. The school was closed in 2006 due to lack of maintenance funds. Most of the buildings have been demolished, with a few remaining. The site is expected to be turned over to Ohio State University's Agricultural Technical Institute, which already uses nearby land that was once part of the Apple Creek campus.]

**January:** The Committee for the Mentally Retarded urged members to support the sale of the Fur Raffle tickets. This is their one big fund raising project, the proceeds which will be shared by the Mental Health Group.

**December:** The Mental Health Committee Chair explained the Committee's purpose. They have adopted a 30-man ward at Cleveland Receiving Hospital. On the fourth Monday of each month, they visit their ward. The men plan the programs, in which all participate. After the program, the Committee serves coffee and goodies.

[Historian's note, per CPI's site: The Cleveland Psychiatric Institute established the Cleveland Receiving Hospital in 1945 for short-term psychiatric observation, care, and treatment of the

mentally ill, especially patients with mild conditions in the early stages and possibly short duration. Due to poor bureaucratic management and eventual changes in handling the mentally ill, the hospital was closed in 2009.]

**January:** The Mental Health Committee didn't pay their usual visit to the hospital in December, but sent each man a Christmas card and took them cigarettes and candy. In response to the men asking for a subscription to the Plain Dealer, the Committee provided a one-year subscription on behalf of the Club. A quiz show is being planned for the next visit later in January, and it didn't appear that the men were too happy about that!

**December:** The Fairnighters Dance Club has climbed to 60. The upcoming Christmas Dance on December 14<sup>th</sup> is a complete sell-out.

**January:** The Fairnighters Dance Club's next dance is scheduled for mid January.

**December:** Twenty-seven new members were welcomed. One-third of the Club is now made up of new members.

**January:** Two new members were welcomed to the Club.
