We are coming down to the wire. Please come to Sally Lisowski's home on **Wednesday**, **February 5**, **at 7:30 p.m.** to put the bags together that everyone gets at check-in. Thank you to Sharon Bowles for helping to make the favor that goes in the bags. You did a really nice job on them. If our decorations committee needs a work night, they will let everyone know. Check your emails for any updates that may come up.

We are looking to sell out again this year. Please let all of your friends, co-workers, other clubs, neighbors, etc. know about our event. Hand out flyers. We need everyone's help to sell the tickets. Should we sell out, we can start a waiting list. We have advertised in both the *Sun Herald* and *West Life* newspapers as well as placing flyers at the Gemini Center and the Fairview Library. Thank you, Helen Davis, for taking our flyer to the Community Council meeting, and to Dick Cause for taking flyers to both the FP Youth Association meeting and the Education Foundation meeting, and anyone else who have taken flyers to work or to other clubs or events We have also contacted people who are not in the club and are not friends of our members who have come to the event in the past. Hopefully we have adequate publicity about our major fundraiser.

Remind your guests to bring their tickets with them and to be **on time**, arriving between 6:30 and 6:45. We need to get started as close to 7:00 as possible. We can't start if there is a long line in the hallway waiting to check in and that cuts into the evening. Doors open at 6:30, but we will not serve any wine until 7:00, or until after the speeches. Everyone is anxious to get started. Let them know we are catering the event this year, still having appetizers and desserts. Also knew is that we will accept most credit cards for silent auction items, as well as cash or checks. 50/50 raffles and raffle baskets are cash only. Tell people to dress in the Hawaiian theme if they wish. They will be getting Hawaiian leis at check-in.

We are so looking forward to having the event catered this year. This will free up a lot of people to help out during the event. We still need people to work shifts at the raffle table. Each winery donates two bottles of wine which we put in two baskets along with other items

to be raffled. Let us know if you are willing to work a shift. Shift 1 is from 6:30 to 7:30. Shift 2 is from 7:30 to 8:30. Shift 3 is from 8:30 to 9:30. First come, first serve. We'll fill in as we hear from you.

Also needed are people to pull sheets at the end of the auction. Only two people signed up at the general meeting. We need at least eight to ten people. The auction is spread out throughout the back wall and into the coat room. Every item has a bidder sheet that needs to be pulled. We need people as soon as we declare the auction closed, to grab the auction bidder sheets so no one tries to put bids in after it's over.

During the evening, we need everyone to refill water pitchers that will be on all of the guest tables. If you see a pitcher low or empty, please grab it and fill it up in the kitchen. Just remember which table it belongs to. There is no sign-up sheet for that. If you see it needs to be done, please do it.

From time to time, please check the dessert room. Condense items as the night progresses. Take the empty trays into the kitchen to be washed. We will need people to wash and dry trays. Let's keep the dessert room stocked and clean.

And of course, we need everyone's help at clean-up time. The more people helping, the sooner we can go home.

We cannot instill enough that this is the **club's** major fundraiser. **WE** (all club members) are the hosts, not just the chairpeople. Please greet people, thank them for coming, ask throughout the night if anyone needs anything. Make sure they are having a good time. We want them to come back next year. We want them to tell their friends what a great time they had and how friendly our club members are. We know you all are fantastic, show them we are.

Last but not least, *thank you*. Thank you for your donations, thank you for selling tickets and buying tickets. And to our chairs, *thank you* from the bottom of our hearts. It's going to be a spectacular night!
