Proposed Bylaw Amendment

ADD the following sections to Article III on Membership:

Section 4: The Corporation welcomes as members all women who meet the membership requirements set forth in Section 1 and does not discriminate on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, disability, marital status, sexual preference, or military status. The Corporation is committed to providing an inclusive and welcoming environment for all and expects members to comport themselves in ways consistent with that goal.

Section 5: Members may terminate membership voluntarily at any time or by not renewing their membership by payment of dues. The Board of Directors, after an appropriate hearing, may by a majority vote of those present at any regular or special board meeting, terminate the membership of any member for cause, including failure to pay dues or conduct prejudicial to the interests of the Corporation. Conduct prejudicial to the Corporation would include, but isn't limited to, harassment or discriminatory conduct inconsistent with the Corporation's commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion.
