

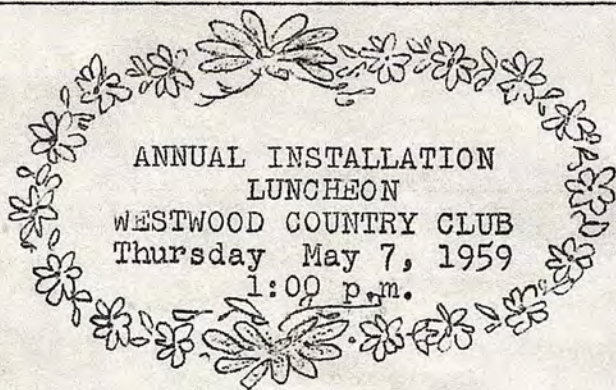

A telephone committee is being formed. The Civic Committee can use you! Call Mary Everett (ED 1-0396) if you are willing to help.

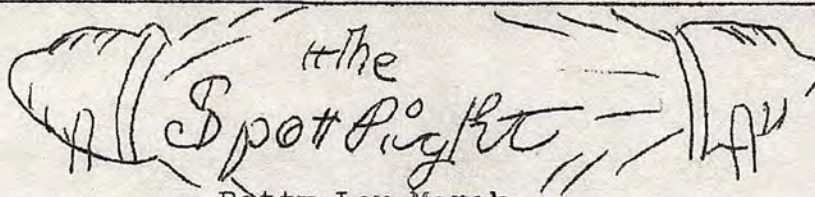

Betty Lou Marek

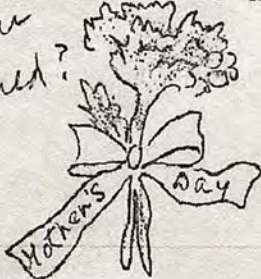
Exceptionally well qualified for the job she so capably filled for two years is FAIR-VIEWS editor, and newly elected Vice President, MARY LOU JORDAN.
