



Scholarships for High School Seniors

The Fairview Park Women's Club (FPWC) is a nonprofit group that promotes civic projects, social welfare, and community improvement. The club was founded in 1954 and is open to all women aged 21 and older. Each year, the club awards one or more college scholarships to graduating high school seniors who are residents of Fairview Park, Ohio.

Scholarships are open to students of all genders.

The amounts of these one-time grants vary, depending upon how much the club raises during the year through its ways and means projects. In recent years, scholarship awards have ranged from \$500 to \$2,000.

We are glad that you are applying for one of the club's scholarships.

Please follow all instructions in preparing and submitting your application.

1. You must be a graduating high school senior and a resident of Fairview Park, Ohio, with a minimum GPA of 3.0 to be eligible for a high school scholarship from FPWC. Other than meeting the minimum threshold, GPA is *not* a factor in scoring for our scholarships. Applications for our scholarships are evaluated on a combination of commitment to volunteerism/community service and need.
2. This application is a fillable form; please use a PDF reader (Adobe Acrobat, Mac Preview, etc.) to complete the form. Save the filled-out form and be sure to include your name in the file name.
3. Please remember to submit **ALL** required documentation as described in the application: completed application, a copy of your high school transcript, essay, and a PDF of the Eligibility Overview tab of your FAFSA Submission Summary showing your Student Aid Index (SAI); see below for details. Submissions that do not include **ALL** required documentation will not be considered.
4. Please complete the application as soon as possible. Supporting documents should be sent via email to FPWCScholarship@gmail.com from a **personal** email address (schools have started restricting links and attachments sent through their systems, so *do not use your school email address*). We will acknowledge receipt of all applications and supporting documents. If you send materials but do not receive an acknowledgment within 5 days, please email us to inquire.
5. ALL applications and supporting materials must be **received** by the FPWC **no later than APRIL 15, 2026**. Applications and/or materials received after that date will not be considered.
6. Applications are evaluated with all identifying information hidden from the committee. All applications and related information are kept confidential. All decisions of the Fairview Park Women's Club on awards are final and not subject to review.
7. Scholarships will be awarded in May, and monies are sent to directly to the awardee's institution.

What is the Student Aid Index (SAI), and why do we need it?

While financial need is a factor in determining our awards, it is not the primary factor. *A high degree of need will not guarantee an award, and a low degree of need will not automatically disqualify you.*

We no longer ask for specific financial information from students and their parents; instead, we use the SAI, which is generated in the Federal Financial Aid application process. This number determines your degree of eligibility for financial aid. The combination of SAI, family size, and number of siblings in college helps us get a sense of all applicants' relative financial need.

To find your SAI, sign in to your FAFSA account at StudentAid.gov, choose the correct FAFSA form, and go to the Eligibility Overview tab. Your SAI is toward the bottom of the page.

Fill in your SAI on the application. If your SAI is a negative number, be sure to include the minus sign.

In the upper right corner of the Student Aid website, click “print this page.” Within the print dialog, use the option to print to PDF (where that option is depends on your computer setup). Attach that PDF in an email to FPWCScholarship@gmail.com.
